

Heidegger on Being and the World

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"To think is to confine yourself to a single thought that one day stands still like a star in the world's sky." Heidegger

The ontological distinction is between beings and their Being.

The ontic/ontological distinction lines up with that between beings and their Being.

On the broadly epistemic dimension, beings are *discovered* and Being is *disclosed*.

Heidegger has a three-part ontology, comprising Dasein (us) and *two* kinds of beings whose Being is *not* that of Dasein.
